Kia ora koutou

This week my newsletter reflects a number of recent conversations around safety.

On Monday I shared information from the Ministry of Education for schools around coronavirus on Facebook. I will continue to do this if there is additional information that would be useful to our community. This is a potentially fast-changing situation and at this point, all we can do is to follow Ministry advice and school policy.

Several weeks ago, I asked teachers to revisit with our students the usual practices around handwashing and coughing into their elbow and the like. These are normal practices as we come into the usual winter cold and flu season. As a school, we have good supplies of tissues and hand sanitizer. I would like to stress though that if your child is unwell or is coughing and sneezing they should stay at home until they are well.

A number of our staff have completed professional development to renew their First Aid Certificates in the last three weeks. All school trips need to have at least one staff member with a current first-aid certificate.

In the next few weeks, our school will begin a programme of *"Keeping ourselves Safe."* It is a whole-school programme with content that is sorted for different age groups. This programme was developed between schools and the New Zealand Police. It is regularly delivered in schools throughout New Zealand and some sessions including Josh the school community constable. We will send you further information nearer the time.

This summer has not been a good summer for anything pool or swimming related. We have finally had the pool pumps fixed after many delays. The School will refund your full deposit when you return your pool keys as many of you have been unable to use them as you would normally have done. This week we have moved swimming sports for Year's 1 to 10 into November. The Year 11's and 12's will hold their competition separately in-class time.

The year 1-8 trip to Anakiwa on Monday, that was part of sea week has been cancelled due to the weather as well.



The shop is open Mon-Sat 10 -3. It will be open on Sunday 15th March as well.

Enrolments at the Medical Centre – The Havelock Medical Centre has been fully open for enrolments_since June/July 2019, and since that time there had been 750 new enrolments, at Havelock and Springlands. Those new to the area can have an immediate enrolment. Those who wish to transfer from another Marlborough Practice will go on the waitlist for enrolment. This is

because they do already have a doctor, so those without a doctor will be ahead of them. However currently that waitlist is only 3 weeks

Patient Portal – Springlands Medical Centre (and therefore Havelock Medical Centre) has signed up to the national patient portal system- Health 365. You can now manage your health online. With this service you can:

- *Make appointments with your GP or nurse
- *Access your medical records
- *Access the consultation notes your doctor makes
- *Order repeat prescriptions *Track your lab/test results
- *Get a list of scheduled events, e.g. due dates for check-ups, follow up care etc

To sign up, grab an enrolment form from Havelock Medical Centre or the Havelock Charity Shop. Fill it in and bring it to the medical centre. Note: If you only have one email address for a couple, you will need to sign confidentiality agreements. It is better to have separate email addresses.
